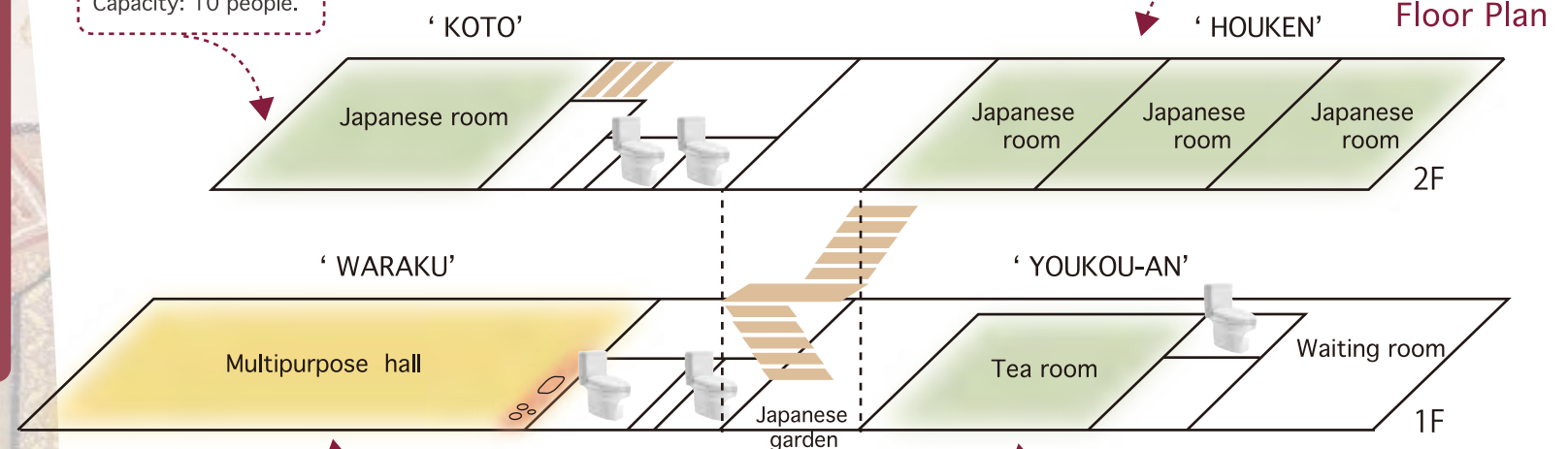
【Facilities and Service】

- The building entrance is handicap accessible.
- The entrance to Tea room and Multipurpose hall is disabled friendly.
- A large Japanese room and three smaller Japanese rooms separated by sliding doors are located on the 2nd floor.
- The building is equipped with 5 public restrooms, including one handicap accessible restroom.
- A chair lift for the elderly and the disabled is available.
- Full-time support from English speaking staff and certified care provider.
- Groups of up to 30 members are permitted.
- Located in a historical and intellectual area housing Sanjusangen-do Temple, Houkoku Shrine and National Museum.
- Guests may board and exit the bus at the front entrance.



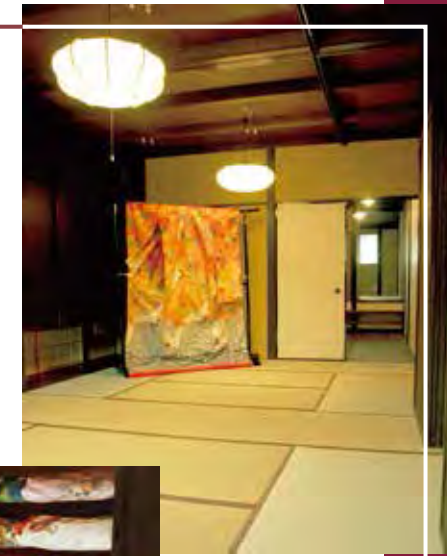
For tea ceremony & origami.

Capacity: 10 people.

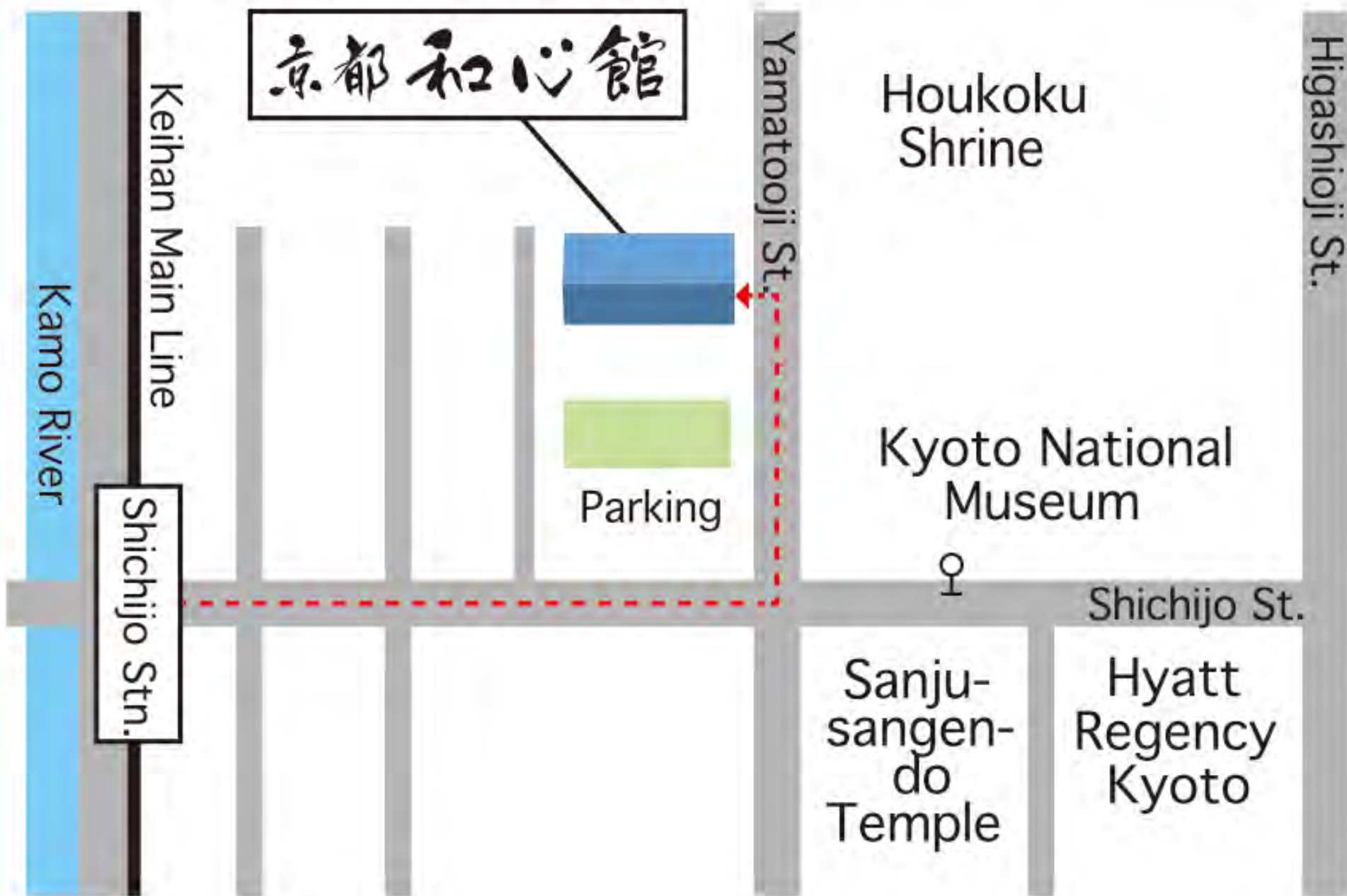


For flower arrangement, calligraphy & cooking.
